

41 He first found his brother Simon and said to him, "We have found the Messiah"

During the season of Epiphany, we listen to gospel accounts of Jesus inviting others to follow him, but, almost as important are the ac-

counts of individuals like Andrew in the verse from above going to find his brother Simon Peter to let him know Jesus is the Messiah. As we begin a new year, it is another chance for us to be intentional about inviting others to come and find the Messiah, Jesus Christ. Maybe that invitation involves asking a friend, relative or neighbor to join you for worship some Sunday, or attend a Bible Study, engage in a service project where our love of neighbor is tangible, hands-on. Maybe that invitation comes through simply engaging in conversation with others about the difference knowing Jesus makes in your daily life.

Though Lutherans are clear that it is the Holy Spirit that creates faith and converts hearts and minds, we also are clear that the Holy Spirit uses followers of Jesus as instruments of invitation, like Andrew was for his brother. During this first quarter of 2020, I want to challenge each of us here at LoC to pray specifically for opportunities to share our faith, and for God to put on our hearts or our minds specific individuals whom the Spirit has been preparing for an invitation or a conversation.

Though some of you may be surprised, I was recently getting my haircut. Being the frugal

person I am, I go to a barber college near my home. Each time I walk in, I generally have a different student, and each time as they seek to be friendly and practice customer service, they will ask a few questions about my day or where I work. At this most recent sitting, I shared I was a Lutheran pastor. Given that he was not Christian, nor religious, he allowed me a few moments to explain who Lutherans are. He then asked me of all the things I preach or teach what is the most important? Without flinching I responded, "The unconditional love of God revealed for all humans in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ." I then affirmed that I seek to teach that every human is created in God's image and the God we worship is a God of love and forgiveness. Though I did not have a card on me, he asked for my card next time I come in, because he wanted to come visit and see if what I shared was really what happens.

May we not be surprised at the opportunities the Lord will provide us in being able to extend an invitation or engage in a conversation about our Lord and our faith in Jesus. It may be a co-worker, a classmate, a cashier, a mechanic, a teacher, a neighbor, a golfing buddy, or a family member who just might appreciate hearing or learning about a God who is not busy condemning, but is about loving and including.

Happy New Year Love of Christ Lutheran Church!

Bringing in a new year is always exciting and invites one to think about the creative things God will begin anew. There have been a couple of things on my mind as I begin this first year into ordained ministry. While I know that this isn't a new concept, it is certainly one in which we need to be reminded of and keep in front of us. We can no longer assume that people understand the basic biblical stories or teachings in the Christian faith. I know that this is not big news for most of us, but, we, as a body of faith in Jesus Christ, need to understand that a new level of intentionality is required of the church and Christians in order to share the gospel of Jesus Christ with the world as well as those in households of faith. As we look forward to this new year, it is my hope that we can look at the things we do here at Love of Christ and mark it with intentionality. This year of intentionality is what I might call new birthing. Just remember, birthing always comes with some pangs!

Faith Formation: We have in place Adult, Youth, Children, and Wow teams. These teams will be addressing how we develop and implement faith formation at LoC and faith in our homes. As we form our classes, we would like to keep Lutheran theology as a part of that and having curriculum deeply imbedded in our catechism and our baptismal promises, always keeping in mind that faith is a gift formed by the power of the Holy Spirit through personal trusted relationships, often times found in our everyday lives and our own homes. The church is also a living partnership between the ministry of the congregation and the ministry of the home. Research has also shown that churches who create opportunities for the mixing of the generations (intergenerational events) have stronger relationships formed and faith is deepened. Some of the intentional intergenerational opportunities this year will be through our season of Lent, Fellowship Picnic, VBS, God's Work Our Hands day (Feb. 8) and Walk to Bethlehem.

A **Faith In Action Team** will be forming in January that will hopefully unite our outreach ministries so we are not duplicating the needs of our various outreach services. One of our first items on the agenda will be establishing a line of communication. We will also be discussing the different outreach ministries of LoC and learn of each ministry and what it does. Reaching out and helping others always brings about challenges. One of the main focuses of this group will be asking some intentional questions about the ministries we support and paying attention to sustainability, accompaniment and our relationships with the organizations we walk with. A question we will be asking is: **how can we connect the neighborhood we are living in with the ministries that we do?** One of the first ways we can answer this question is by taking the time to hear the needs of our neighborhood.

God our creator is always creating something new; may we have the eyes to see it and the ears to hear it! Looking forward to this new season with all of you!

Grace and peace in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior!

A New Year is amongst us and an opportunity for us to live into the "newness" of life God is bringing us. This time of year also provides us an opportunity to reflect on where God is calling Love of Christ and an opportunity to reflect where God is calling God's church. I am offering two things in this newsletter: 1) A reflection on our time thus far in Youth Ministry at Love of Christ and to let you all know what is coming up in Youth Ministry. 2) An invitation to you to enter into a conversation about Youth Ministry.

We (students, awesome adult volunteers, the congregation, and I) started this process in September. The Youth Ministry went to Schnepf Farms, celebrated the Youth who Confirmed their faith, had our Fool's Night Out with the High School students, participated in the Feed My Starving Children event in conjunction with our 30 Hour Famine, went shopping to support the families the congregation adopted for Christmas, participated in our Walk to Bethlehem, and all of this occurred in the midst of our weekly Youth Group, TIM, and Confirmation meetings. Central to all of this, we were building relationships and connecting with one another.

Personally, I have spent a lot of time learning the culture of Love of Christ. This includes learning the processes of how things have been done in the past like budgets, communication, and ministry logistics. Believe it or not, almost all processes and practices are influenced by the culture of Love of Christ. Learning culture also includes understanding what is the heart of the congregation and the ministries the congregation is partnered in. Like many churches, members of the congregation might have different answers for what is at the heart of Love of Christ, and it is important that those voices are heard so that we can better understand ourselves and where God may be calling us!

As I mentioned earlier, building relationships will continue to be a priority for the ministry as we explore our 2020 calendar. Another important focus of the ministry will be those involved in leadership in Youth Ministry. We will continue to seek out and utilize the gifts and talents of these individuals to explore where God is calling the Youth at Love of Christ, as well as to continue the partnership of the congregation, adult volunteers, and the Youth involved in our ministries and programs.

Lastly, I would like to briefly explore the question: What is Youth Ministry? At its core, Youth Ministry is an age specific (grades 7-12) ministry to develop disciples of Jesus. There are many who have different definitions of Youth Ministry. All of this to say, it is a challenge to even define what Youth Ministry is. More so, it is difficult to define "how to do" Youth Ministry. There are countless books, seminars, experts, and resources to help us with the "doing" part of Youth Ministry. Youth Ministry involves evangelism, worship, service projects, discipleship, Confirmation, fellowship, intergenerational ministry, leadership, fun & activities, faith formation, and mentoring (just to name a few). All of this influenced by our consumer culture and its push of adolescent culture. Youth Ministry is (and has been) heavily influenced by secular culture in the States and Western civilization. Research from Barna, Pew Research, and denominational studies indicate we are in a post-Christendom world and the Church in the states is shrinking. Perhaps the reality of where we find ourselves is a call for us to reflect. While our anxieties may push us to do more to save the Church and our Youth, maybe this is an opportunity for us to think deeply about the practices in ministry we have developed. Perhaps it is an opportunity for us to examine what we care about most in ministry, where God is calling us, and to ask ourselves, "What is Youth Ministry and how do we do it?" Through that reflection we may find that our priorities, our perspectives, even our hearts have changed, and that we may find ourselves "doing" Youth Ministry.

May we be open to God's blessing and our neighbors this New Year!

Homebound Members receive Monthly Communion through trained **Agape Callers**Women volunteers provide support during our twice a month **I-Help** ministry to homeless women **Prayer Ministry** (Prayer Chapel host, prayer list, card ministry)

Volunteer Pastoral Care phone calling to those on our weekly Prayer List

Compassionate Cooks gather periodically to prepare in our CoC kitchen ready to eat meals that can be stored in our LoC freezers and given to families in need

Member Assistance Fund-donations to this fund are made available as financial assistance support to LoC households going through crisis or facing an immediate need

Transitional Assistance Fund-donations to this fund are used to purchase gas cards, meal cards and bus passes for non-members in transition



Ash Wednesday and Mid-Week Lenten Services Begin Wednesday, February 26

What is Lent?

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday, the Saturday before Easter. Lent comes from the Anglo Saxon word *lencten*, which means "spring." The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry.

Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent was a time to prepare new converts for baptism. Today, Christians focus on their relationship with God, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of themselves for others.

Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter" and the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the Resurrection.

During the season of Lent, all of us are invited to consider special ways to serve or give in response to the hungry and the poor in need around the globe. Special envelopes are near the entrance to the Sanctuary and CoC to support the following: (See next page)



The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America works with partner Lutheran churches around the globe to do development and relief work that gets at the root causes of global hunger and poverty. There is a high commitment to empower and employ local leaders, particularly women, in an effort to lessen dependency on outside sources of support. Special 40 days of Giving Calendars are available for households to learn and pray for those who are hungry in this world. Feed My Starving Children (FMSC) is a Christian nonprofit dedicated to providing nutritious meals to children worldwide. FMSC meals are hand-packed by volunteers and sent to an incredible network of partner organizations who distribute them to those in need. Nearly 1.2 million volunteers packed more than 333 million FMSC meals in 2017. More than 90 percent of total donations go directly to feed kids and FMSC has earned the highest four-star rating from Charity Navigator for 13 consecutive years. Visit fmsc.org for more information. Each November, Love of Christ Lutheran Church has hosted a mobile packing event where 5-95 year olds give two hours of time to pack nutritional meals that will be sent to FMSC partners feeding hungry children. To host such an event costs about \$35,000.00. LoC has to raise that money prior to the event and historically has relied on the generosity of a single major donor. If this event is to be sustained over the years ahead, others in this community will need to share in supporting the cost.

Love of Christ Endowment Fund Re-Launches in 2020

In October, 2014 the church board established a bylaw resolution to implement the Love of Christ Endowment Fund. This was conceived

as an extension of the LOC Mission statement "As people of God we are called, gathered and sent to proclaim the grace and love of Jesus Christ.".

Some initial work was done and many households indicated they were planning to leave a legacy gift or bequest to the fund. Over the course of pastoral transitions, the fund went on hiatus and initial committee members were unable to continue to serve.

Fast forward to February, 2019 when new Endowment Committee members were elected to re-introduce endowment to the congregation. Our vision is to "provide a vehicle to receive, manage and distribute enduring gifts to nurture faith among current and future generations, both locally and globally." Our desire is to encourage and enable participation in this fund by the Love of Christ family.

You will be hearing more about endowment, why it is important and how you can become involved in the coming months. Information will be available through bulletins, email, a brochure and planned meetings in February and March.

The Endowment Committee looks forward to your participation to invest in a perpetual, proactive way to further the church's mission now and in the future.

The families must be United States citizens or on permanent residency status, demonstrate a need for adequate housing, have a two-year history of stable income between 30 and 65 percent of the median income, have a good credit history, complete 100 hours of "sweat equity" on a fellow Habitat owner's house, and an additional 300 hours on their own home before taking occupancy, and complete classes on home maintenance, financing, and home ownership. The homes are NOT given to the homeowners. At the time of the home completion and dedication, the homeowners make their first payment on a profit-free mortgage, and the average payment is about 25% of their income, which includes the principal, property taxes, homeowner's insurance, and a maintenance account. These funds are then used by Habitat to build even more homes. The results are incredible – families living in sub-standard housing and caught up in a cycle of poverty become home-owners, tax-payers, and contributors to the well-being of their neighborhoods!

The secret she kept from everyone was that she was a scientist and she knew a few secrets about the enemy. She had an idea that might help the country fight the Nazis...if anyone would listen.

The Water Dancer

Young Hiram Walker was born into bondage. When his mother was sold away, Hiram was robbed of all memory of her – but was gifted with a mysterious power. Years later, when Hiram almost drowns in a river, that same power saves his life. This brush with death births an urgency in Hiram and a daring scheme: to escape from the only home he's ever known.

This journey takes Hiram from the corrupt grandeur of Virginia's plantations to the dangerously idealistic movements in the North. Even as he's enlisted in the underground war between slavers and the enslaved, Hiram's resolve to rescue the family he left behind endures. This story is about the separation of families and the war these slaves waged to simply make lives with the people they loved.


