GETTING READY FOR LUTHER YEAR 500...

LUTHER 2017 500 YEARS REFORMATION

"Luther's Early Years"

I was once told by a Catholic lady that Martin Luther only rebelled against the Catholic Church because he wanted to get married. Another lady once told me that Luther was a man with profound psychological problems related to guilt and depression. Therefore

he is not to be taken seriously. Yes, Luther did suffer from bouts of melancholy but, essentially, neither point is true.

Luther's father, Hans, moved his family from Moehra near Mainz to Eisleben shortly before the birth of his second son, in order to take charge of two copper foundries he had purchased. Hans Luther was a poor man and a common laborer until he married into a family of means in Moehra.

It must be admitted that Luther's childhood years were less than pleasant. His father exercised absolute and brutal discipline because children were regarded as unruly beasts that had to be tamed. It was a sin for parents to indulge their children. Luther once told his students that, "My father once whipped me so severely that I ran away from him, and he was anxious until he won me to him again." "For the sake of a nut my mother beat me until the blood flowed" and Luther once remarked that "some teachers are as cruel as hangmen." He was once beaten fifteen times before noon by a teacher because he could not decline and conjugate even though he had not yet been taught how.

Luther's father was angry when his son forsook the study of law and went into the monastery and, yet, Luther cared for his parents and once invited them to move to Wittenberg so he could take care of them "in the best way." Hans Luther became a convert to the new evangelical faith and, on his deathbed, proclaimed "If I did not believe, I would be a clown."

Luther's world was a world of strict allegiance to the dictums of the church and also a world of superstition. Luther believed in witches and recalled that a neighbor in Mans-

feld was a witch. Witches could turn butter into dung and could turn themselves into mice in order to steal milk. He thought that sometimes the devil appeared as a goat. The forest was a dark and menacing place. Witches held their Sabbaths there and there evil spirits abounded, waiting to prey upon travelers. Luther didn't attend his own father's funeral in Mansfeld because of the supernatural dangers of the forests. (He wrote instead a famous letter about faith to his father.)

Perhaps Luther stuck to his belief in witches and malevolent spirits to his death but he proclaimed God as sovereign over all the powers of darkness. A few scholars believe that Luther's anger about his father's discipline made him a victim to his fear about death and God's judgment. The facts, however, do not bear that out, even though one respected scholar, Erik Erikson, has emphasized the impact of Luther's repression by his harsh father. Another scholar more recently has emphasized the impact of Luther's fear of death. But Luther's legacy for us is about the hope of the resurrection. Also, Luther's marriage to Katharina von Bora happened long after he had effectively departed from the Church of Rome and the constraints of church-imposed celibacy. He married Katharina only after heavy persuasion by friends.

Luther was a man of his time and place, but in spite of 16th century attitudes about witches, Jews, and the authority of the rulers, he transcended the dimensions of time and space and recaptured the good news of the biblical witness. We Protestants of today must hold him accountable for his defense of autocratic rulers (in the face of the peasants' rebellion) and his bitter diatribes against the Jews late in his life (who, in his opinion, stubbornly rejected his gospel). But to future generations after him, his take on the gospel has continued to inspire freedom and justice.



Parish Nurse—Katie Thorson - February is Heart Month



Heart disease is the leading

cause of death for men and women in the United States. Every year, 1 in 4 deaths are caused by heart disease.

The good news? Heart disease can often be prevented when people make healthy choices and manage their health conditions. Communities, health professionals, and families can work together to create opportunities for people to make healthier choices.

Make a difference in your community: Spread the word about strategies for preventing heart disease and encourage people to live heart healthy lives.

Your heart works hard for you nonstop for your whole life. So show it some TLC.

Making small changes in your habits can make a real difference to your ticker.

"It's like finding the fountain of youth," says Donald Lloyd-Jones, MD, of Northwestern University's Feinberg School of Medicine. "People who follow these steps not only live longer, but they also spend a lot more time healthy, without cardiovascular disease." Even better? You don't have to work on all 10 steps at once. Even if you improve just one or

two of these areas, you can make yourself less likely to get heart disease. Of course, the more tips on this list you follow, the better. So let's get started.

1. Aim for lucky number seven.

The next time you're tempted to stay up later than you should, remember how comfy that pillow will feel -- and how good a full night's sleep is for your heart. In one study, young and middle-age adults who slept 7 hours a night had less calcium in their arteries (an early sign of heart disease) than those who slept 5 hours or less or those who slept 9 hours or more. The type of shut-eye they got was important, too. Adults who said they got good-quality sleep also had healthier arteries than those who didn't sleep soundly. If you have trouble falling asleep or staying asleep at night, or if you don't feel refreshed after a full night in bed, talk to your doctor about how healthier sleep habits might improve your slumber.

2. Keep the pressure off.

That cuff squeezing your arm at every doctor's visit is important. It measures the amount of pressure flowing through your arteries with every heartbeat.

If your blood pressure gets too high, the extra

force can damage artery walls and create scar tissue. That makes it harder for blood and oxygen to get to and from the heart. The heart has to pump harder and gets worn out faster. If it can't get enough oxygen, parts can start to die. Get your blood pressure checked every 3-5 years if you're 18-39. If you're 40 or older, or if you have high blood pressure, check it every year. Cut back on salt, limit alcohol to no more than one to two drinks a day, favor healthy eating habits (think fruits, vegetables, whole grains, and lean protein) manage your stress, and work out. These changes are often enough to bring your blood pressure back down into the normal range. If not, your doctor might recommend you also take medication.

3. Slash saturated fats.

To help your heart's arteries, cut down on saturated fats, which are mainly found in meat and full-fat dairy products. Choose leaner cuts and reduced-fat options. Also, totally quit trans fats, which are found in some processed foods. They drive up your "bad" cholesterol level. Check ingredient lists for anything that says "hydrogenated" or "partially hydrogenated" -- those are trans fats. If it's been 5 or more years since your last cholesterol blood test, you're probably due for one.

4. Find out if you have diabetes.

Millions of people do and don't know it. That's risky because over time, high blood sugar damages arteries and puts you at risk for heart disease.

Your doctor should test your blood sugar if you are 45 or older, if you are pregnant, or if you're overweight and have other risk factors for diabetes.

If you find out that you do have diabetes, work with your doctor on your lifestyle (diet and exercise) and any medicine that you may need. If you have borderline high blood sugar, also called prediabetes, take action now to turn things around.

One simple swap is to trade processed carbs (like white rice) for fiberrich whole grains (like brown rice). Every positive change you make in what you eat and how active you are will help. Over time, you'll be able to do more.

5. Move more.

To keep it simple, you can aim for 30 minutes a day, 5 days a week of moderate exercise. That includes any activity that gets you moving around and breaking a slight sweat.

"If you're doing nothing, do something. And if you're doing something,

do more," Lloyd-Jones says.

Also, pay attention to how much time you spend seated, whether it's at work, in your car, or on your couch at home. You want to cut that time down. "We now know that even if you exercise for 30 minutes a day, being sedentary for the other 23 1/2 hours is really bad for your heart," says Monika Sanghavi, MD, assistant professor of cardiology at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center. Break up long periods of sitting, and stand or walk while doing things like talking on the phone or watching TV.

6. Clean up.

Your heart works best when it runs on clean fuel. That means lots of whole, plant-based foods (like fruits, vegetables, nuts, and seeds) and fewer refined or processed foods (like white bread, pasta, crackers, and cookies).

It's time-tested wisdom.
"The latest fads get overplayed by the media. But the core of what makes a heart-healthy eating pattern hasn't changed for decades," Lloyd-Jones says.

One of the fastest ways to clean up your diet is to cut out sugary beverages like soda and fruit juice, which lacks the fiber that's in actual fruit.

"We drink way too many of our calories," Sanghavi says. "And those calories don't fill us up the way real food does, so we have them in addition to everything else we're eating, with no nutritional benefit."

7. Think beyond the scale.

Ask your doctor if your weight is OK. If you have some pounds to lose, it's not just about calories

Sure, you'll probably want to change your eating habits and be more active. But there's more to it than that.
For many people, "emotional eating" is where they find comfort and stress relief, and how they celebrate. So if it's hard to change those patterns, it can help to

8. Ditch the cigarettes, real and electronic.

Smoking and second-hand smoke are bad for your heart. If you smoke, quit, and don't spend time around others who smoke as well.

E-cigarettes are popular, but they're not completely problem-free.

"They don't contain the harmful chemicals in cigarette smoke, and they can help some people wean themselves off of smoking," Lloyd-Jones

says. "But they still do contain nicotine, so your goal should be to quit completely, not just switch to a less toxic version."

9. Do more of what you love.

"I tell my patients that managing stress in a healthy way, whether it's meditation, yoga, or exercise, is really important," Sanghavi says. Make it a point, too, to spend time with people you're close to. Talk, laugh, confide, and enjoy each other. It's good for your emotional health and your heart.

10. Celebrate every step.

Making changes like these takes time and effort. Think progress, not perfection. And reward yourself for every positive step you take. Ask your friends and family to support you and join in, too. Your heart's future will be better for it!

Some copies of the necessary tax forms (AZ Form 321) are on the kiosk, or can be downloaded online. The recent - and much-needed rain has caused a delay of our start date...we started on Saturday, January 21st. Those of you that attended our 30th Anniversary supper got to meet our home-owners-tobe, Cornelio and Martha Mejia and their three sons. Aren't they a wonderful family? The family bio, as well as the revised schedule, is now available on the Habitat kiosks. If you can't swing a hammer, but want to help, we are in great need of people to host lunches for our workers! We started with an opening prayer at 7:30 in the morning, and then broke at 10:30 for the signing of blessings on the wall frames that we had just erected. Lunch was served, and we finished-up and put away our tools about 2:00 p.m. Their new home will be one half of a duplex, and will take about fifteen weeks to complete. The

address is 1937 E. Don Carlos in Tempe - very near University and the 101 freeway. Parking is VERY limited, so we suggest car-pooling. HABITAT is trying to arrange parking at a near-by church and will provide shuttle service. Look for details in the Sunday bulletins. Habitat for Humanity is an international, non-profit, faith-based organization with the goal of eliminating sub-standard housing throughout the world. Love of Christ Lutheran has helped build thirteen homes in the Mesa/Phoenix/Apache Junction/ Guadalupe areas! A virtual history of our ministry is depicted in photographs hanging on the entry wall of our Center of Compassion. The homes are NOT given to the homeowners. The Bible tells us that "if you loan money to the poor, do not charge interest". At the time of the home completion and dedication, the homeowners make their first payment on a profit-free mortgage, and the average payment is about 25% of their income, which includes the principal, property taxes, homeowner's insurance, and a maintenance account. 





The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America is one church body organized in three expressions – congregations, synods and the churchwide organization.

- 3.7 million members
- 9,300 congregations 65 synods

While one congregation is opening its doors to neighbors experiencing homelessness, another is serving meals at a soup kitchen, or caring for God's creation by cleaning up local parks and roadways. When you serve, you serve and minister on behalf of all of us. Each one of us has a unique story, and we are part of a

larger story that makes up the ELCA.

- On September 8, 2015, more than 4,000 congregations took part in God's Work. Our Hands., a dedicated day of service across the ELCA.
- We planted **62 new congregations** in 2015.

In 2015, we launched congregational renewal efforts in 134 congregations.

LEADERSHIP

- Bishop Eaton introduced two webcasts as a new way to learn and stay connected with one another. Because of the success of these webcasts, more will be broadcast in the coming months and well into the future.
- We supported **228 students** at seven ELCA seminaries through the ELCA Fund for Leaders.
- We support the work of 8 ELCA seminaries and 26 colleges and universities.

We recruit, prepare and implement a system for the assignment ofmore than 9,000 rostered leaders.

HUNGER AND POVERTY

- We supported creative solutions to hunger and poverty in nearly 60 countries around the world, including 347 programs in the United States through ELCA World Hunger.
- Committed to work to help end deaths from malaria in 14 countries in Africa through the ELCA Malaria Campaign.
- In 2015, gifts given to ELCA World Hunger totaled \$21,944,702—more than in any single year. These are gifts that will provide immediate food and shelter, as well as support toward lasting systemic change.

- Together, we've raised \$15 million for the ELCA Malaria Campaign to help end deaths from malaria in 14 African countries. In doing this we:
- o Educated 2 million community members
- Distributed 50,000 insecticidetreated bed nets
- o Tested 160,000 people for malaria, and if positive, provided treatment
- o Trained 10,000 local volunteers in prevention and treatment
- o Empowered 12,000 households to be economically stable Provided 32,000 pregnant women prevention medication

GLOBAL CHURCH

- We support The Lutheran World Federation's global communion of churches with more than 80 companion churches in other countries.
- We sent **73** young adults into global service and added one new country program in Cambodia through the Young Adults in Global Mission program, and continued support of at least **220** missionaries in more than **40** countries around the world in 2015. In 2015, we awarded **6** college scholarships to promising young women from our global companion churches.


